To earn the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Certificate, the student must: (1) satisfactorily complete by the end of the Spring semester all college requirements for a Certificate requirement with a grade of C or better in each course or have completed a Certificate.(2) Cypress College Local General Education or the California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) requirements; (3) any elective courses needed to complete a minimum of 60 units; and (4) have a minimum GPA of 2.0. Note: All General Education and prerequisite courses must be completed by the application deadline.
